

Dignitaries Visit the Shafer Farm

State and local officials requested a review of historic properties in and around South Mountain to look for historically significant sites that might contribute to the development of South Mountain Battlefield Park. Elizabeth Shatto, Director of the Heart of the Civil War Heritage Area, arranged for them to visit relevant sites.

Their first stop, on a beautiful June morning, was the Shafer Farm. Paul Gilligan gave a presentation about the history of the house and farm, BPA's goals for its continuing restoration, and its overall importance to the Burkittsville-South Mountain area. Ron Dustin conducted a tour of the house, including the bay window from which General Franklin viewed Crampton's Gap before the Battle of Crampton's Gap, the Battle of South Mountain. Our guests expressed their appreciation of both the significance and the beauty of the Shafer house, the farm, and their unspoiled rural surroundings, as well as their gratitude for all that BPA has already accomplished.

Recent Accomplishments

Firewood: Almost all the fallen limbs and branches from the property have been cut up, split, and either sold or put in piles for use in future Civil War Reenactments.

Windows: The six windows on the Catholic Church Road side of the house have been rebuilt on-site by our contractor from Smithsburg, MMI Built LLC. We hope that all the windows, the exterior doors, and nine pairs of shutters on the front of the house will be totally refurbished by MMI Built this summer.

Ron lives on Poffenberger Road. He studied engineering and architecture at the University of Maryland. In 2001 Ron retired as longtime President/CEO of Dustin Construction, Inc., but he remains as chairman of the board. Through the years he has taken leadership positions in many community organizations, including Jaycees and Lions Clubs in Montgomery County, the Frederick Rescue Mission Board, the University of Maryland University College Board of Visitors, Burkittsville Ruritan, and of course BPA. Ron was the organizer and coach of three baseball teams in the 1950s and is a charter member of Faith Baptist Church on Jefferson Pike, serving there in many capacities including Deacon, Elder, and President of the Trustees.

Ron was married for 59 years, until her death, to Shirley Dustin; he and Pat Dustin were married in 2018. He has five children, fourteen grandchildren, and ten great-grandchildren. Ron says he "loves fishing, having breakfast with friends, supporting good causes, helping others, and serving the Lord."
